Your Affiant is a detective with the Clay County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) assigned to the General Investigations Unit (GIU). Your Affiant has approximately seven (7) years of sworn law enforcement experience. Your Affiant swears and affirms under oath or affirmation there is probable cause to believe the Suspect, Andrew Tyler Simmons, has committed the offense of Grand Theft contrary to Fla. Stat. § 812.014(2)(c). Your Affiant's oath or affirmation is sufficiently grounded upon the following probable cause:

On August 1, 2026, Patrol Deputy J. Turner, #10034, responded to Target (1490 County Road 220) in reference to a shoplifting in progress call for service. Upon arrival, Deputy Turner contacted Loss Prevention Officer (LPO) George Langone ("Reporting Party" / "Witness") who observed the Suspect in the store and stated the Suspect was "actively putting items into a laundry basket."

Patrol deputies established a perimeter around the Target awaiting the Suspect's inevitable attempted escape. The Suspect proceeded to fill a shopping cart and laundry basket with items, mainly sports trading cards. The Suspect proceeded to exit the store via an emergency exit, successfully maneuvered around the perimeter, and fled the area. LPO Langone reviewed the incident via Target's surveillance video and confirmed the Suspect bypassed all points of sale with a total of \$1,701.50 worth of merchandise. On August 3, 2026, this case was assigned to me for further investigation and follow-up.

LPO Langone knew the Suspect from prior interactions and provided Deputy Turner

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with the Suspect's name and date of birth. LPO Langone has personally interacted with the Suspect on three separate occasions, once in September 2025 and twice in December 2025. These encounters occurred while LPO Langone was working at Target's Ortega location (6331 Roosevelt Blvd, Jacksonville, FL 32244). LPO Langone completed a sworn written statement. This offense was captured on Target's surveillance cameras. Deputy Turner collected the video via a USB drive and physically submitted it into evidence.

I requested the Crime Analysis Unit (CAU) prepare a simultaneous photographic array to be prepared for presentation to LPO Langone. On August 14, 2026, a photographic array was completed and provided to me. At my behest, Detective R. Romig, #08794, met with LPO Langone at Target and administered the photographic array. LPO Langone selected photograph #4, Andrew Simmons, thereby positively identifying him as the individual who committed the offense (i.e., the Suspect).

During the course of this investigation, I have attempted to conduct an interview with the Suspect with no success. I attempted to call the phone number most recently attributed to him; however, it was disconnected. On August 13, 2026, Detective R. Cintron, #08183, traveled to the Suspect's last known residence of record, 3770 Toledo Rd Apt 64, Jacksonville, FL 32217, to attempt to locate and interview the Suspect on an unrelated matter; however, Detective Cintron was unable to contact anybody and he left a contact card at the door. Detective Cintron contacted the leasing office and found the Suspect was not listed as a tenant of the apartment.

Queries through judicial databases revealed the Suspect had one prior petit theft conviction pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 812.014(2)(f), on May 5, 2026. The conviction occurred in Duval County, Florida and was under Duval County Clerk of the Circuit Court case number 16-2026-MM-006392-AXXX-MA. Finally, at the time of my authoring this affidavit, the Suspect appeared to have an unconfirmed warrant for his arrest stemming from failing to appear on the original charges of possession of a scheduled II substance and possession of drug paraphernalia. There was no bond accessed and the originating jurisdiction was St. John's County, Florida.

The Suspect has perpetrated two additional retail thefts from this Target location on July 14, 2026, and August 8, 2026. These cases were assigned to me and being investigated under CCRs 2026-016513 and 2026-018649; they are both active investigations. Based upon the above facts and circumstances; I have determined there is probable cause to believe the Suspect committed the offense of grand theft contrary to Fla. Stat. § 812.014(2)(c). The Suspect has alluded capture or discovery to this point and his whereabouts are not known.

LPO Langone knew the Suspect from prior interactions. LPO Langone has personally interacted with the Suspect on three separate occasions, once in September 2025 and twice in December 2025. These encounters occurred while LPO Langone was

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working at Target's Ortega location (6331 Roosevelt Blvd, Jacksonville, FL 32244). LPO Langone completed a sworn written statement. This offense was captured on Target's surveillance cameras. Deputy Anderson collected the video and uploaded it into the CCSO's digital evidence server. I had the opportunity to review this video, which corroborated LPO Langone's account of this incident.

On July 15, 2026, at 16:05 hours Patrol Deputy P. Labelle, #09811, responded to Target (1490 County Road 220) for a report of shoplifting. Deputy Labelle authored an Initial incident report and on July 16, 2026, this case was assigned to me for further investigation and follow-up.

Returning to July 15, 2026, Deputy Labelle met Loss Prevention Officer (LPO) George Langone (Reporting Party/Witness). He reported that on July 14, 2026, at approximately 21:23 hours, he observed a Caucasian male, whom he knew to be Suspect from prior contacts as an LPO, enter the store via the main entrance. LPO Langone visually tracked the Suspect as he proceeded to the trading card isle with an empty shopping cart. The Suspect emptied 45 boxes of MLB trading cards into the shopping cart. Once in possession of the items, the Suspect proceeded to the rear fire exit door and exited the store, passing all points of sale. The Suspect did not purchase, or attempt to purchase, the items. The Suspect was last seen heading towards East West Pkwy and from there, unknown.

LPO Langone provided Deputy Labelle with the Suspect's name, date of birth, and a Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) case number, 25-615131, where the Suspect was named a suspect. LPO Langone has personally interacted with the Suspect on three separate occasions, once in September 2025 and twice in December 2025. These encounters occurred while LPO Langone was working at Target's Ortega location (6331 Roosevelt Blvd, Jacksonville, FL 32244). LPO Langone completed a sworn written statement. This offense was captured on Target's surveillance cameras. Deputy Labelle collected the video via a USB drive and physically submitted it into evidence.
